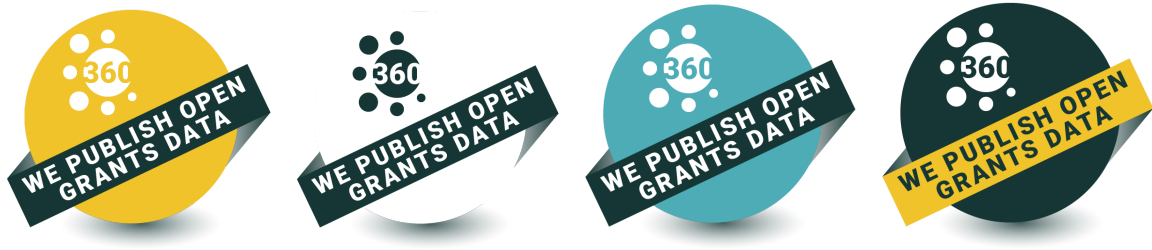


360Giving Data Publisher Badges



Who are these for?

These badges are for organisations that publish their grants data in the 360Giving Data Standard. Adding a badge to your website will tell the world that you publish open grants data and are part of the open grants movement.

How do I add one to my website?

Choose which badge works best for your website. We recommend that you put your badge in the header or footer section of your homepage.

Here's some HTML snippets to insert the badge onto your website, along with a link to [threesixtygiving.org](https://www.threesixtygiving.org).

If you're using WordPress you might need to use the "Text" tab in the editor to add the code. You can also use the "custom HTML" block if you're using the gutenber editor, or you can add it to your sidebar with the "custom HTML" widget.

Green

Different sizes

To change the size of the badge change the “`max-width: 200px`” part of the snippet. For example, `max-width: 100px` will make it smaller.
